Understanding the World

What do we need to wear if we are going on a winter's walk? Wrap up warm and use your senses (sight, smell, hearing, touch) to explore the signs of winter. What can you see? What can you hear? What can you collect? Can you make a collage of the natural objects you collect.

Mathematics - Wider Maths

Click here to sing our days of the week song. Talk about what day of the week it is. Can your child sing along?

Today, we are going to practise daily routines and doing things in the right order. Have a go at making a drink of juice/a sandwich/getting dressed but do everything in the wrong order (e.g. shoes on and then socks on top) - the sillier the better! Is that right? Talk about when we eat breakfast, dinner, tea and what we do before we go to bed (brush teeth, have a bath, read a story etc).

If your child has been struggling with the new routine it might help to create a visual timetable so that they gain awareness of time and what happens and when e.g. At breakfast 8:30AM we eat cereal. Encourage your child to decorate their timetable. Show your child the time on a clock when it is time to do the next task.

Let's get creative!

Have any elves visited your house this week? Can you build a home for the elves to live in? How big would it need to be? What would they need inside? You could use old boxes, building bricks or even natural items found outside.



Friday

Mathematics - Wider Maths

Click here to listen to a song all about a cheeky monkey who likes to hide. Can your child describe where the monkey is?

Today, we are going to practise describing positions. First you could set up an obstacle course (using cushions, chairs etc) and hide a toy somewhere and see if your child can find it by listening to your instructions. Next, using a soft scarf or a piece of material blindfold your child. Gently spin them around a few times and then give them directions to follow to get to the end of the obstacle course. For an extra challenge, can your child give you simple directions to reach the end of the course.

Physical Development

Can you write a tiny letter to an elf? Maybe the elf will reply back. :)

Making Magic!

Gather a selection of different sized pots/pans/ cups and some food colouring or bubble bath. Mix the food colouring/bubble bath with water to create a magic elf potion. Your child could add natural resources such as flowers, leaves, herbs etc. Can they practise careful pouring by pouring the mixture from a pan into a cup and back? What does your potion do? What are the magic words?
