## The latest Covid-19 situation in schools

Unfortunately, once again Covid-19 has begun to cause disruption to the normal workings of the school and we have ended the term with more restrictions than when we started.

As we write this letter the Covid picture nationally is changing rapidly. The Omicron variant is spreading at an alarming rate with cases doubling every two days in the UK. The hope is that the booster programme starts to impact and the rate of infection starts to slow. We do know that it was really disappointing to cancel in person attendance to the Christmas activities but we felt it was the most sensible thing to do given the current circumstances. A link to watch the Foundation Stage/Year1 Christmas play will be sent out on Tuesday.

At this stage we are expecting schools to open as normal in the Spring term. We will continue to ensure that there is increased cleaning in school, staff are being asked to wear masks in communal areas and all areas are well ventilated. ## Bikes/scooters on the playground

It is great to see children back on their bikes and scooters but they are not to be ridden on the playground. The children have been told this. If any children are seen riding their bikes and scooters on the playground then they will no longer be allowed to bring them into school which would be a shame.

## Leaving school

At the end of the school day there will continue to be staggered pick up times to help keep a steady flow of cars and people on the school site.

Please pick your children up between the following times:

Foundation Stage will begin to leave from 3pm from the normal school exit. Year 1 and 2 will start going home at 3pm from the 2 doors leading onto the playground. Year 3 and 4 will leave from 3.10pm from the 2 doors leading onto the playground Year 5 and 6 will leave from 3.15pm from the 2 doors leading onto the playground.

#### Conduct of parents on the school playground

We have recently had reports of a small minority of parents using threatening and abusive language towards other parents on the playground. This type of behaviour will not be tolerated on school premises. Anyone found to be acting in an abusive or threatening manner will be banned from accessing the school site.

### **Earrings**

Earrings are not allowed at Longhill Primary School. Please ensure that your child has removed their earrings before coming to school. If they still have them in and we cannot contact you to remove them then unfortunately your child will not be allowed to take part in any physical activity - this includes going out at playtime. This falls under our health and safety policy.

#### **Mobile Phones**

Reminder that children should not bring mobile phones to school. If a mobile phone is brought into school, it must be handed to the class teacher.

#### **Water Bottles**

Please remember to send your child with a water bottle, clearly named, on a daily basis. Bottles can be refilled in class throughout the day.

#### **School uniform**

The school unform is as follows:

White or light blue polo shirt Navy blue jumper / cardigan Black/grey trousers (short or long) / Black/grey skirt Appropriate footwear

If a child is not wearing the correct uniform parents will be contacted by the phase leader to discuss how we can support you in any way.

If a child arrives in the wrong jumper they will be asked to remove it and put it on their peg.

#### PE kit

The PE kit is as follows:

White / Light blue T shirt
Blue / Black shorts or plain tracksuit bottoms
School jumper can be worn if they are outside.

If your child is not in the correct PE kit we will provide them with some spare kit that they will be asked to change in to.

Children may still come into school in PE kit when it is their PE day. The PE days are as follows:

Monday - Foundation 2 and Year 2
Tuesday - Year 3
Wednesday - Year 5 and Year 4
Thursday - Foundation 1 morning and Year 6
Friday - Year 1
