What are you children learning about in Personal, Social, Health Education this year (PSHE)?

During the second part of the Summer Term the children cover Changing Me



In Foundation Stage the children learn to name parts of their body and know about healthy foods. They begin to understand that we start as babies and grow into children and then adults.

Through Key Stage One the children start to understand the life cycles of animals and humans. They talk about how their body has changed since they were a baby, for example, crawling to walking. They also identify parts of the body and use the correct names.

By the time they leave Key Stage Two the children have learnt about self image and how their bodies change during puberty, both physically and emotionally. They learn to describe how a baby develops from conception through to birth. Finally they discuss what they are both looking forward to and are worried about in relation to transition through to secondary school.
